We are especially proud of our record of player retention. Given the development and growth of our returning players and the quality of the new members joining us, we are looking forward to even more success for our players and teams.

Here are some highlights from last year and to start this year:

- SDA Development, an affiliate of SDA Sports, acquired ownership of the Central New York Family Sports Center last September, thereby adding a top training facility sporting two quality indoor fields and several outdoor natural turf fields to our existing facilities. We have also renewed our contract with SISC for its two top quality indoor fields, giving us, with the SDA Center, a total of five (5) indoor training fields for our programs.
- SDA has also added Paul Kekevian, as our Zone I Director of Coaching to our roster of our highly qualified coaches in the SDA family. Paul holds a USSF "A" license and brings with him a wealth of knowledge and experience to the SDA family. Welcome Paul! Look for more about Paul on our website and in future newsletters.
- We are entering our third year as a member of the Girl's Academy. We are proud of our accomplishments in the first two years of our membership in the Academy. Our first year saw our club finish 5th overall out of 11 clubs in the Northeast Conference. In our maiden effort our 2005 and 2009 girls qualified for the playoffs and this past season our 2008 and 2009 teams qualified.
